SAVING OUR SHORELINE

My name is Kristie Roedl and I began volunteering at Camp Knutson in 2017. I became the WAPOA (Whitefish Area Property Owners Association) Shoreline Restoration director in 2018. I was in charge of managing grant money secured by Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation for shoreline restoration projects through WAPOA. The program is funded in part by the Clean Water, Land, and Legacy Amendment, Clean Water Fund.

After discussion with Jared it seemed there was significant shoreline erosion at Camp Knutson. Jared and I worked together to secure bids to address the erosion on the Trout Lake side and the point where boats pass from Whitefish into Big Trout Lake. We agreed to have Prairie Restoration do the work in August 2019. There was a biodegradable blanket installed to help secure the

soil on the Trout side. Then 1,620 native plant plugs were installed and grass and wildflower seeds were broadcast on the peninsula.

In August 2020 it was determined that additional seeding and plugs were needed. We also decided that coir logs should be installed on the point to help protect the shore from the waves and ice heave. We again worked with Prairie Restoration to complete this project. After further discussion it was decided that installing Willow Wattle behind the Coir logs would help stabilize the point from erosion even more. After some research Caitlin and a crew of volunteers were able to harvest some willow, do live staking of dormant willow cuttings, plant some native plugs and create and install the willow wattles. We plant only native plants/wildflowers and shrubs with long roots to help stabilize the soil in accordance with the grant regulations. My son, Grant Roedl assisted with the watering of the project area in the fall.

Recently Jared submitted a proposal from Prairie Restoration to the Land and Waters Preservation Trust for approval. This proposal is for additional shrubs and native plugs to be planted in the spring. We should know in April if this request for funding is approved.

I am happy to say that most of these projects have been in partnership with Soil and Water and their grant funds. This is a beautiful collaboration between WAPOA and Camp Knutson for the benefit of the protecting our environment. We have discussed using the Camp Knutson site as an outdoor laboratory as we design our WAPOA knowledge-based curriculum for school age children. A big thank you to the Camp K staff and volunteers for all the watering and maintenance of the site. Shoreland restoration is a journey that we are all on to protect our shoreline and lakes for future generations.





THANK YOU, GRANT!

In September, Grant Roedl stepped up to serve as our Interim Recording Secretary and undertook the project of developing an online archive of CKV Board of Directors records. This collection of records is housed on Dropbox and can be accessed by CKV Officers.

Grant has a Master's in Library Science from the University of Wisconsin and had most recently worked as an Intern Archivist at the Isle Royale National Park. While living with family (Kristie & Frank Roedl) in Crosslake in 2020, Grant volunteered at Camp Knutson on projects like the nature walk and shoreline restoration. When Mom Kristie mentioned our need for a Recording Secretary, Grant stepped up to fill that vacancy! He accepted a position in Pennsylvania at Charles River Laboratories in January, but worked diligently to complete his archive project for us before his departure.

HONORING THE TRI-CHAIRS OF THE QUILT AUCTION

As we have all experienced, the 2020 year at Camp Knutson was changed in huge ways by the COVID pandemic, leaving our counselors and volunteers with no choice but to create something virtually for the campers and families we serve. For one event, like the Quilt Auction fundraiser, online opportunity may have made it even better!! Most of the QA success this year was also the direct result of three dedicated, creative, and energetic CK volunteer leaders. Here is a tribute to their efforts and teamwork.

PENNY BRYCE shared, "Sewing has been part of my entire life. My great aunt had her own sports lettering business since the early 50s and my grandmother always had quilting bees at her house. I am now retired from the shop I first managed, then owned, for 50 years. In that time, we sewed many names and numbers for sport teams all over the state from little league to the pros including 49 years with the Minnesota Vikings, original North Stars lettering, Minnesota Kicks, and even some for the Twins, Timberwolves, and U of M."

In the summer of 2007, she heard Rob Larson promoting the Quilt Auction on the radio, and attended, deciding to donate a quilt the next year. Penny did not stop

there...involved in NUTS, she donated a FAVRE jersey and helped with decorating. She cleaned at camp and made cards with campers. Volunteering has always been a part of life since 6th grade for Penny, helping in pediatrics at North Memorial Hospital, beginning skiing for hearing impaired, and as an election judge since retiring.

CINDY MELSBY told how she grew up in St. Paul and had three children from her first marriage. In those early years Cindy lost her infant son, Aaron, born with Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome, and he continues to be her inspiration as she volunteers at Camp K. She now has two grown daughters. Cindy was employed by West Publishing for 37 years, where she met and married husband, Lee in 2000. Over the years Cindy volunteered at the Disabled Veteran Camp and Feeding My Troops, sewed for Bundles of Love, worked with feeding the homeless, and other local charities in the cities.

Following retirement, Cindy and Lee moved from Inver Grove Heights to the lakes area in 2015. Knowing no one "up north", she "reached out to neighbors and even strangers in local coffee shops." When a friend told her about Camp K, she signed up at the 2016 Spring Meeting to make cards and be a "runner" at NUTS. She got involved with the Quilt Auction through her quilt group, and helped the organizers throughout the year get ready for the event. Before long she was co-chairing both the food service for Sundae Funday for two years and the NUTS silent auction for three years with Kristie Roedl!! "I have met so many wonderful people at the camp and feel so connected with so many."

BETH McCONVILLE and her husband of twenty-three years, Brian, moved to the Crosslake area just two years ago from Bettendorf, Iowa. "A dream come true to be living on a lake in Northern Minnesota", says Beth. She has three adult step-children and three grandchildren. Beth works for Renewal by Andersen from home and in her spare time she enjoys volunteering, baking, reading and hosting friends and family. She learned about Camp K from a

neighbor and attended the 2019 Spring Meeting, eager to find a way to meet people and get involved in the community. She volunteered in a variety of roles but it was the Quilt Auction that captivated her. Having a background in design, Beth fell in love with the beautiful textiles. "I'm not a quilter but I really admire the skills, patience and creativity that go into making a quilt."

So, last year at this time, with three talented women all passionate about Camp and specifically the Quilt Auction, certainly one of them might like to chair the 2020 event! None of the three wanted to chair the event alone and had never even worked together. But when the idea came to involve all three in leading the auction, it was an immediate "yes", and a TEAM was born. The new partnership grew their friendships into a "closely woven working relationship" that sprouted an extraordinarily successful virtual event during this difficult pandemic year. Beth dubbed the team: the "QAC Squad"! Penny and Beth both describe their experience working with the team as "a blessing". CKV is certainly blessed to have this QA team with us at Camp Knutson for 2021.
