Dennis "Dennie" Fry has served as Facilities Manager at Camp Knutson for 7 years. Camp Director Jared Griffin says "Dennie is like camp's Swiss army knife. He is incredibly skilled and talented in so many different ways."

Dennie grew up on a farm in Hastings, MN and has always loved the outdoors. After several years working construction, remodeling and roofing, he began work as a church facilities manager. The silver lining is that it has provided the time and space to work on more projects like new decking around the dining hall and the all-accessible nature trail. Camp K Updates

While this summer was unique at Camp Knutson, many positive events, projects and opportunities still took place. We are very grateful for the volunteers who helped with camper connection opportunities, gardening, various maintenance projects, and putting on wonderful fundraisers. Two of the highlights from the summer were Night Under the Stars and the Quilt Auction. As you know, both events were conducted in a virtual format and were still highly successful. Volunteers continued to play a very active role in that success—from collecting and organizing auction items, publicizing and marketing the events, to the follow up support. We are very proud of our community for stepping up to help in so many generous ways.

Five Camp Knutson summer staff spent a few weeks at camp to collaborate with one of our camp partners to facilitate virtual camp for campers. The staff planned games, activities, conversation topics and non-virtual activities that campers completed on their own time. We had about 60 campers join us—all who thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to connect with each other, meet new friends and participate in a few camp activities.





We have been busy with many other projects around camp! The deck of the Dining Hall was stripped and completely redone, the large beach hill was paved, a half court basketball court was added by the waterfront area, the ins-and-outs of the new ski boat were learned, more plants and vegetation were added to the shoreline project at the point, and many hours have been put in to begin constructing our new fully accessible nature trail (in the woods to the left as you drive in). The nature trail is 5 feet wide, will be 800 feet long, is made from a lifetime composite wood and includes an outdoor classroom in the middle

of it. Educational components will be added throughout the trail for campers to learn about their surroundings. We are excited to welcome back the campers to all of these new updates!

Cooper, Caitlin's goldendoodle and the camp dog, is off at eight weeks of advanced obedience training. Once he returns, Caitlin and Cooper will complete both the American Kennel Good Citizen and Therapy Dog tests. The hope is for Cooper to be integrated into camper programming for Summer 2021.
